Hours of Operation

No launching watercrafts and entrance gate closes 1/2 hour before recreation area closes for the day.

- **June 1 - September 3** - Daily from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
- **September 4 - September 30** - Daily from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- **October 1 - November 14** - Daily from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- **November 15 - March 31** - Seasonal Closure

Additional Information

- Smoking, all types of grilling and fires are *not permitted*
- Motorized boats must have a valid state registration from any state
- All motorized boats and trailers must be inspected and are subject to decontamination
- No fueling on the lake
- Open air exhaust boats, motorized personal watercraft (e.g. jet skis), houseboats, and cabin cruisers are not permitted
- Public access beyond developed areas and the lake shoreline is not permitted
- Discharge of firearms is not permitted in improved recreation area
- Non-authorized drone use is not permitted

Fishing Regulations

Rainbow Trout, Brown Trout, and Kokanee Salmon have been stocked since 2011. Other species in the lake include White and Flannelmouth suckers, Fathead Minnows, Johnny Darters, and Crayfish. Fishing Regulations are:

- Bag limit is 4 trout per day and 8 in possession (no size limit restrictions)
- Anglers can use traditional baits (see Colorado Parks and Wildlife Fishing Brochure for definitions; e.g., no aquatic live bait allowed)
- Limit on Kokanee Salmon is 10 per day and 10 in possession. No snagging is allowed in the fall
- No fishing around the boat ramp
- Please put fish entrails in the garbage, not the lake

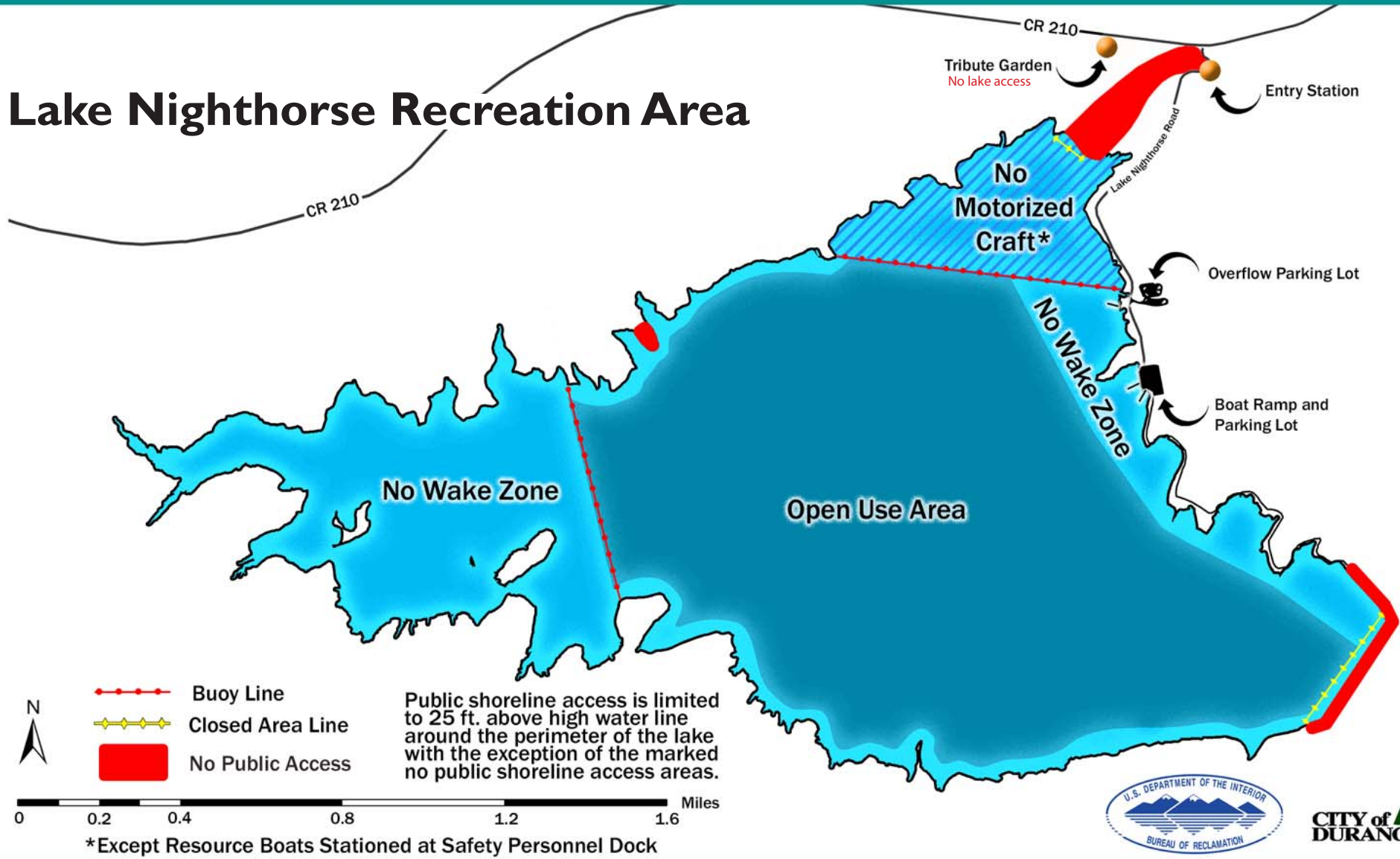

- Fee Use Area
- Day Use Only
- Leave no trace, dispose of trash in proper receptacles
- Pick-up and properly dispose of pet waste
- Pets must be on leash
- Vehicles and bicycles off road are not permitted

- Fires are not permitted
- Fueling of boats in designated area only
- In Open Use Area, boats travel in a counter clockwise direction
- Public shoreline access is limited to 25 ft. above high water line
- Alcohol and/or drugs are not permitted, including marijuana products

- No glass containers
- Hazards not marked
- Follow public conduct rules per federal regulations 43 CFR Part 423
- Disturbance to archaeological resources is prohibited per ARPA of 1979
